SnapChat



Snapchat is a text-, photo- and video-messaging app that you use to send messages that will disappear after your friend receives them. You determine how long the recipient(s) can view the message.

YouNow/Periscope



Parents need to know that YouNow is a live video-streaming and chat app. Both the user agreement and app stores specify that users must be 13 and older. Teens register using an existing social media account (<u>Facebook</u>, <u>Twitter</u>, or <u>Google+</u>), though they can view broadcasts without registering. Privacy is definitely an issue, but kids can change their usernames to something more anonymous than their Facebook or Google+ identities.



Vine




Video sharing app designed in a way for you to film short, separate instances so they can be linked together for a total of six seconds (loops). Each short video plays in a continuous loop.
